



## **European Commissioner for Agriculture and Food Christophe Hansen Visits Horizon Farms' Greiveldange Facility as Agritech Startup Acquires Fësch Haff and Secures Millions in Seed Fundraising to Champion Luxembourgish Food Sovereignty**

GREIVELDANGE, LUXEMBOURG – June 29, 2026 — In 2026, Europe faces an unprecedented challenge regarding food security, supply chain vulnerability, and ecological sustainability. Luxembourg represents an acute case of this reality, currently importing a staggering 95% of the produce consumed within its borders.

In response to this crisis, Horizon Farms is proud to announce its strategic acquisition of Fësch Haff SARL. Founded in 2021 in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, Fesch Haff is an innovative agricultural-tech start-up specializing in pioneering aquaponic and hydroponic technologies. By combining aquaculture (fish farming) and hydroponics (soilless plant cultivation) into a single, closed-circuit ecosystem, Fesch Haff's groundbreaking technology delivers high-quality, pesticide-free, local produce using a fraction of the water and land required by traditional farming.

Supported by a network of predominantly Luxembourgish investors, Horizon Farms has secured substantial seven-digit amounts in combined capital following this acquisition. This significant financial backing will enable Horizon Farms to accelerate the scale of its proprietary closed-loop system, scale up Fësch Haff's core technologies, and construct the Grand Duchy's very first commercial-scale agritech greenhouse, thereby affirming a more sustainable, independent food future for Luxembourg and beyond.

### **High-Profile European Commission Delegation**

On Monday, June 22, 2026, Horizon Farms hosted European Commissioner for Agriculture and Food, Christophe Hansen, along with the Luxembourgish Representative for the European Commission, Anne Calteux, for an official tour of the FH pilot greenhouse in Greiveldange. The construction of this cutting-edge facility with state of the art R&D installations was made possible through strategic support and funding from both the Luxembourgish Ministry of Economy and the Ministry of Agriculture.

The high-profile diplomatic visit focused on how Luxembourgish-grown agritech can serve as a scalable blueprint for wider European food sovereignty.

When speaking of the visit, Commissioner Hansen said the following;

*I am always encouraged when I meet people who are not afraid to try something new, and that is exactly what I saw at Fësch Haff. Their aquaponics system shows that producing food in a smarter and more sustainable way, with less water and without pesticides, is not just an idea for the future, it is already happening here in Luxembourg. This is exactly the kind of*



*innovation that can help make our food systems more sustainable while creating new opportunities for farmers.*

The successful visit, strategic acquisition, and the secured seed funding solidifies Horizon Farms and Luxembourg's joint position as frontrunners in Europe's sustainable transition, proving that the solution to global supply challenges begins with local innovation.
