



Student Delegation Position: Election recommendations

As a student delegation, we want to address some major issues that are affecting the student community at the University. In this text, we will cover the following topics: housing, mobility, the University Campus, and sustainability.

Housing

One of the major issues that students face at the University is the lack of affordable housing. We believe that more University housing should be built, especially in large modern residences, with a particular focus on providing more options in Luxembourg-City.

Additionally, we believe that non-EU students should be allowed to live across the border if they choose to do so. This will give them more options to find affordable housing while studying at the University. Furthermore, students who live in the far North of the country do not get any state aid for housing, even if their single journey time is often over two hours. To address this issue, a specific aid for those students should be created.

Mobility

Another issue that students face at the University is the lack of reliable public transport to Belval. We believe that this must change, and accessibility to Belval should be improved for the whole country, not just those living in Lux.-City or in the South of the country.

Furthermore, due to the bad public transport system, many students are sometimes forced to use cars to get to Belval, which can lead to parking issues. Those students should not be penalized, and affordable parking should be made available to them.

University Campus

The University Campus should be a welcoming and inclusive space for all students. When planning a new campus, we believe that there should be more green spaces where students can hang out, study, and relax. Additionally, we believe that the Belval Campus should be officially considered a University Campus by the authorities responsible for handling the campus.

Moreover, University restaurants should be open in the evening as well to cater to students who have classes or other activities outside of regular business hours. Finally, we believe that facilities for sports should be available to all students on campus.

Sustainability at the University

The University has a responsibility to reduce its carbon footprint and promote sustainability. We believe that the University should become carbon net zero by 2030, and the Belval Campus should become greener with more plants and green spaces.

Additionally, we think that the University should provide lockers for bikes and more electric charging stations on campus to encourage sustainable transportation. By taking these steps, the University can become a leader in sustainability and set an example for other institutions to follow.
